The readings appointed for today

THE FIRST READING Genesis 14:17 to 20

After Abram's return from the defeat of Chedorlaomer and the kings who were with him, the king of Sodom went out to meet him at the Valley of Shaveh (that is, the King's Valley). And King Melchizedek of Salem brought out bread and wine; he was priest of God Most High. He blessed him and said, 'Blessed be Abram by God Most High, maker of heaven and earth; and blessed be God Most High, who has delivered your enemies into your hand!' And Abram gave him one-tenth of everything.

THE GOSPEL READING John 2:1 to 11

On the third day there was a wedding in Cana of Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples had also been invited to the wedding. When the wine gave out, the mother of Jesus said to him, 'They have no wine.' And Jesus said to her, 'Woman, what concern is that to you and to me? My hour has not yet come.' His mother said to the servants, 'Do whatever he tells you.' Now standing there were six stone water-jars for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to them, 'Fill the jars with water.' And they filled them up to the brim. He said to them, 'Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward.' So they took it. When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom and said to him, 'Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.

CHRISTMAS APPEAL

SMOAT has now launched it's 2020 Christmas Appeal. For those people who did not manage to see it, below you will find links to the presentation, to our website and to a Virgin Money Giving page.

This year we are supporting two projects. The first, a Chase Africa project will fund mobile outreach health clinics in Kakamega County in the west of Kenya where there is limited access to formal health facilities. In one day a clinic can reach around 2,000 people at a cost of £1,200. We would very much like to fund at least two of these clinics. The second project is from Afrinspire and is based on Lunga Island in Zambia, where only 30% of the population has access to safe water and less than 47% has access to basic sanitation. This project will support the building of shallow wells which will provide basic sanitation systems and clean water to a community which has already been ravaged by flooding. The cost of two wells is approximately £2,700 and we hope to be able to provide enough money to cover this cost, with any extra money raised going towards other sanitation improvements. Each well will provide clean water for up to 1.500 people.

We would very much like you to support these projects. The people in these two communities not only have to live without basic medical care or clean water and basic sanitation, but they are also facing the further anguish of COVID-19. By supporting us, you will enable us to provide thousands of people with a
